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### Example Biography

*CHIEF JUSTICE ANGELA M. ORDOÑEZ is the Chief Justice of the Probate and Family Court having been elevated to this position in July 2013. Before being appointed as an associate justice in the Norfolk Probate and Family Court by Governor Deval Patrick in 2008, Chief Justice Ordoñez worked with the Greater Boston Legal Services from 1989-1993. She also worked as the Assistant Register of Probate at the Suffolk Probate and Family Court. She served as first justice in the Nantucket County Probate and Family Court, and later was named first justice of Norfolk County Probate and Family Court in 2011.*

*Chief Justice Ordoñez graduated from Northeastern University in 1986 and Northeastern Law School in 1989. She has been very active in the MBA, having chaired the association's Diversity Task Force from 2009 to 2010. As chair, she created the Tiered Community Mentoring Program, which teams up practicing attorneys with diverse students in high school, college and law school. It is aimed at exposing inner-city students to opportunities in the legal community that would otherwise not exist for them. The MBA received the ABA Partnership Award for the Mentoring program.*
