CLINTON RESIDENT AND ATTORNEY ELECTED PRESIDENT-ELECT OF MASSACHUSETTS BAR ASSOCIATION

Attorney Edward W. McIntyre has been elected president-elect of the Massachusetts Bar Association for the 2007-08 year, beginning on Sept. 1. McIntyre is a solo practitioner concentrating in civil litigation in state and federal court who practices and lives in Clinton. He is an expert in spinal cord and brain injury law.

A member of the House of Delegates since 1998, McIntyre has served the MBA in many capacities. He has sat on the President's Task Force on Judicial Evaluations and the MBA's ABA Nominating Committee. McIntyre has served two terms as MBA vice president and one term as secretary. He also fulfilled one-year appointments as vice-chair and chair of the Judicial Administration Section Council. McIntyre has chaired the MBA's Judicial Performance Evaluation Standing Committee since 2004, is a former recipient of the MBA's Community Service Award, and is a Massachusetts Bar Foundation fellow.

McIntyre obtained his bachelor's degree from Saint Bonaventure University, received a master's degree from Assumption College, and earned his law degree from New England School of Law. He served as an infantry officer in Vietnam from 1969-1970 with the 173rd Airborne Brigade. An active member of the Clinton community, McIntyre is a former president of the Wachusett Chamber of Commerce and has hosted a local television program since 1994.

Alongside McIntyre, the other 2007-08 MBA officers include: David W. White Jr., president, Boston, Clinton; Denise Squillante, vice president, Fall River; Robert F. Lucas, vice president, Wakefield; Valerie A. Yarashus, treasurer, Boston; and Robert L. Holloway, secretary, Peabody.
