## **Boston attorney elected chair of Massachusetts Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division**

Boston attorney David S. Bradley has been elected by the Massachusetts Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division Nominating Committee as chair of the association's Young Lawyers Division, for the 2009-10 year. His term began Sept. 1.
